I make every attempt to make our classroom a fun and engaging place to learn. We are a community that helps to support one another, encourage each other and grow together. We use Restorative Practices to help build our sense of belonging and community within our class. Ask about our morning circles! Our classroom **values each individual** and we are all on our journey together. There are times when we will not all get along, however using our WITS, Stand Up-Speak Out, Tattling Turtle, and other initiatives will help us work and solve problems together. *Please encourage your child to share with you or with me if any issues they can't solve arise.*

I use the **Agenda** as well as **phone calls** to make contact with parents. Please remember to use the Agenda or write a note if there is a bus change or if you have a question. I also use **email** to contact parents if you prefer. Please remember that it helps me to know if there is a reason your child may be upset or not themselves (**didn't sleep well, had a fight with mom, worried about a loved one, feeling under the weather etc**). A quick note in their Agenda can help me make their day run smoother. **If I do not initial or make a comment in the Agenda I did not see it.** I try to initial all Agendas in the morning and check for notes.

### Classroom Management

## Overview of Grade 3 Program

### Language Arts:

- Reading, writing, speaking and listening are the components of our language arts program. Other subjects will be integrated within our Language Arts program as our new Nova Scotia Primary-Grade 3 Curriculum states.
- Grade 3 students write the Early Language Literacy Assessment (ELLA) in October.

### Reading and Viewing

- Students will engage in daily independent reading, shared reading, guided reading, novel and author study, literature circles, poetry, home reading program, visual texts, word study and non-fiction texts.

### Speaking and Listening

- Students may participate in discussions, read aloud, questioning, responding, reading conferences, readers theatre, following directions, book-talks, book-share, oral presentations, grammar.

### Writing and Representing


- Students will engage in writing a variety of forms such as stories, journals, letters, poetry, reports, reading responses, and story maps. We will study writing conventions, ideas, organization, and language usage. We will study spelling through the use of a word wall and word study activities. The use of the Daily Write will help build upon our writing strategies.

### Mathematics

- Students will be working with numbers up to 999. There are some areas that are being explored more in-depth and other areas of the curriculum that students will explore in later grades however the biggest concept we focus on is Numeracy. Math class has a lot of hands on activities, discussion, exploration and questioning. Therefore when a child misses time from school it is very difficult to catch them up on certain aspects of the curriculum. There is still book work, work sheets etc. however these are not the backbone of our math program.

### Science, Social Studies, Health and Art

- Science, Social Studies, Health and Art will be taught through our literacy and math subjects. We will still be exploring these topics through hands on opportunities, literature, experiments, writing procedures, center based learning and investigations. During our

science exploration we will look at Magnets, Structures, Soil and Plants. Social Studies will focus on looking at and discovering information about our province, Nova Scotia and the people that make up our communities. We will focus on Relationships and healthy living topics in Health.
